

Slenderizing is typically performed to make space for crowded teeth to straighten out. Slenderizing does not cause sensitivity, decay or gum problems and there's no charge for this procedure.

- Slenderizing utilizes a thin, sandpaper-like metal strip to remove about 0.1-0.4 mm of enamel between select teeth. Slenderizing does not cause sensitivity, decay or gum problems.
- Slenderizing is typically performed when you have crowding of your teeth. To create room for your teeth to achieve their best result, we make space in between the teeth.
- Slenderizing is done quickly and painlessly. You do not need to be numbed. After the procedure, your gums may feel sensitive for a day or two.
